The Cherry County Justice Center

Also included in the new addition are new courtroom and administrative space, sheriff's office and police offices.

Kearney County Health Services

Renovation and Addition Project in Minden, Neb.

This spring, voters in Kearney County approved a bond issue to fund a renovation and addition to Kearney County Health Services in Minden, Neb. Construction started late this summer and will take about two years to complete.

The 8,600-square-foot addition to the hospital's south side will accommodate 10 inpatient rooms. These new rooms will be private with their own bathrooms and Internet access. Renovation of 7,900 square feet will add four exam rooms for visiting specialists. Also, as part of the renovation, the pharmacy and nurses station will be relocated between the inpatient and outpatient service areas, making the layout much more efficient.

Prior to the passage of the bond issue, Beckenhauer also completed some much needed upgrades to the facility, including a new CT scanner, CT room renovation, and upgrades to the HVAC and electrical systems.
